### How To Apply:

**Deadline:** February 1, 2010 (1st round) or February 26, 2010 (2nd round). Applications will be accepted on a space available basis until June 1; after May 1 please contact the office to see if space is available.

**Eligibility:** Participants must be American Indian (enrolled), Alaska Native (proof of status) or Native Hawaiian (proof of heritage), First Nations/Metis/Aboriginals; and a current college student, college graduate, or master’s degree student.

**Download an Application:** Students are selected competitively based on a complete application. Applications are available for download on Oct 1, 2009 at [www.collegehorizons.org](http://www.collegehorizons.org).

**Cost \$200 & Airfare:** The \$200 program fee includes tuition, room, meal, program materials, and ground transportation to/from the airport to campus. Participants are responsible for their own airfare/travel to/from the host site.

**Financial Aid Available:** Significant financial aid is available to participants for program fee and airfare. Simply apply for financial aid in the application.
