What is EMDR and How Does it Work?

Eye Movement Desensitization & Reprocessing (EMDR)

- Eye movement desensitization & reprocessing therapy, commonly known as EMDR, is a mental health therapy method.
- EMDR treats mental health conditions that happen because of memories from traumatic events in your past.
- EMDR is a mental health technique that involves moving your eyes a specific way while you process traumatic memories.
- * The goal of EMDR is to help you heal from trauma or other distressing life experiences.
- This technique is effective and can help a person faster than many other methods.
